Labor bills, economic recovery and the state budget, and concerns about the **future of the environment** dominated the legislature this week.

Three labor issues were center state. First, Iowa's largest state employee union has tentatively agreed to a contract that includes **no increase in base pay** in the budget year beginning July 1. The employees had asked for a 5% pay increase for each of the next two years. Only longevity increases will be built into the contract. Each 1% increase in pay costs the state \$32.2 million, according to a government estimate.

The second labor issue revolved around the concept of equal pay for equal work. The Senate on Monday passed **SF 137 WAGE DISCRIMINATION** on a 32-18 vote. Senator Appel, who managed the bill, said that "pay should be based on your job performance, not your religion, age, or gender." Senator Appel cited the fact that women in Iowa earn 78% of what men earn for the same job and according to Senate Democrats, Iowa is 37th in gender wage equity. This bill will now go to the House.

The third issue, **prevailing wage, HF 333**, dominated the whole week in the House. It has been this session's most contentious issue so far. The bill requires that companies that contract for construction of public projects pay workers wages and benefits reflective of those paid in private projects. Several long and late caucuses were held with the Chamber being in session until midnight two out of four nights. Opponents of the legislation say the legislation will elevate labor cost by as much as 36 percent for projects and cost county governments as much as \$6 million a year. The nonpartisan Legislative Fiscal Services estimates the bill would cost state government \$1.2 million a year. Proponents argue that the bill provides fair treatment to all workers, guaranteeing that a subcontractor or contractor couldn't massively underbid its competition by skimping on salaries, training and benefits for laborers. The House is expected to debate the bill this afternoon and send it to the Senate late Friday night.

Iowa's economic recovery effort was boosted this last Tuesday, when President Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, a \$787 Billion package to stimulate the American economy. Iowa will receive **\$1.9 billion** in federal funds for education, health care, and infrastructure investment and will see 37,000 jobs created or saved with money from this federal stimulus package according to the Council of Economic Advisors.

In order to ensure that every dollar is maximized to its fullest extent, the Governor announced several steps to handle the funds:

- He will coordinate a series of working groups representing state agencies that will oversee a range of programs that may benefit from this legislation, such as Transportation, Education, Human Services, Natural Resources, Economic Development, and the Office of Energy Independence. The groups will analyze

the final legislation to assure the funds are maximized and distributed in a timely manner.

- He will work closely with the legislative leadership to make sure that the federal money is spent on priorities in the FY 2010 budget.
- He will continue to find spending cuts in the current fiscal year, monitor the FY 2009 tax receipts, and determine whether any further adjustments need to be made.
- He will promote his \$700 million proposal to bond for infrastructure. Governor Culver concluded his comments by thanking the President for his leadership and Congress for responding swiftly by passing the recovery legislation in a short span of time.

Finally, the **state's environment** received legislative attention with House and Senate approval this week of **HJR 1**, the constitutional amendment to use 3/8 of a cent from any sales tax increase for natural resource projects, such as REAP, watershed projects, trails, lake restoration, parks, and conservation projects. The Governor does not need to sign this legislation because it amends the constitution so it will now go straight to the voters in November, 2010.

In terms of ISLHA, our budget issues are not yet being discussed. There will be a revenue estimating conference in March and with the federal monies there will be impacts on Medicaid and education issues, hopefully positive. It is too early to detail the ramifications.
